Statement of Faith

Regarding The Gospel:

The Gospel is the cornerstone of our Christian faith, encapsulated in the person of Jesus Christ. Through Him, we find redemption and reconciliation with God. It is the true way in which we live our lives as Christians. We should always refer to the Gospel as we live as Christ's followers. As stated in John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

Regarding God The Father:

God the Father is eternal, without beginning or end, the Creator of all things. In Him, we find our existence and purpose. We live through God and want to be with our Father in heaven. Scripture affirms this in Psalm 90:2, "Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God."

Regarding Jesus:

Jesus, the image of the invisible God, is our Savior who willingly laid down His life for the forgiveness of our sins. His sacrifice on the cross exemplifies God's love for humanity. I love people regardless of who they are and want to show that even the most sin-filled people can be saved. Romans 5:8 declares, "But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Regarding The Holy Spirit:

In the ethereal realm of ideas, the equation works, and yet when imparted to physical reality on paper, there are three 1s, and yet mathematically equal to only 1.

Regarding Spiritual Gifts:

Spiritual gifts are bestowed upon believers to improve the Church and advance God's kingdom. My top five gifts are administration, exhortation, hospitality, help, and craftsmanship. They are to be used in service to one another. 1 Peter 4:10 encourages, "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace."

The righteous in Christ will live in bodily resurrection in God's presence for all eternity, while the unrighteous will be shut out from the presence of the Lord.
